"Queering the Human Situation"

An hour-long teleconference with **Dr. Thelathia "Nikki" Young**

Wednesday, June 13th, 2012 1 pm-2 pm EDT

Dr. Thelathia "Nikki" Young is a graduate of UNC-Asheville, Emory University's Candler School of Theology, and Emory University's Graduate Division of Religion. Her work and research primarily focus on ethical issues of gender, sexuality, and race with particular attention to queer Black communities. A womanist and feminist, Nikki employs Queer theories to investigate the human situation. She is currently a Visiting Assistant Professor in the Women's and Gender Studies Department at Bucknell University.

Join us on Wednesday, June 13, 2012, at 1pm (EDT) to talk with Nikki Young about her work in womanist, feminist, and queer theology.

In preparation for the conversation, Nikki suggests that you read Valerie Saiving's 1960 article, "The Human Situation: A Feminine View." Additionally, you may enjoy Nikki's most recent work, "'Uses of the Erotic' for Teaching Queer Studies."
